COMMUNITY CENTRE PROJECT UPDATE: CONSTRUCTION PROGRESS AND FUTURE PLANS

In a recent meeting, the Community Centre committee provided an encouraging update on the much-anticipated Community Centre build project. The construction has reached a significant milestone with the completion of the steel frame, marking a critical phase in the build.

The committee reported that the next major step in the construction process involves the installation of roof sheets. Additionally, the above-ground brickwork and drainage systems are scheduled to start towards the end of August. These developments will significantly advance the project, providing a clearer view of the Centre's future form. The project remains on schedule for completion by the end of April 2025.

The new Community Centre is set to become a pivotal hub for local activities, offering a range of facilities that will cater to diverse community needs. From recreational spaces and meeting rooms to dedicated areas for events and social gatherings, the Centre aims to enhance the quality of life for all residents.

As the construction continues, the committee extends its gratitude to all who have contributed to the project's success thus far including generous donations from the Warboys Women's Institute, Red Tile Wind Trust and the Warboys Community Association. The collective effort and community spirit have been instrumental in reaching this stage, and the committee looks forward to celebrating the completion of the Community Centre with the residents once it opens its doors.

Reduce, Re-use, Recycle

You may have heard this phrase before, but have you ever stopped to think about why they are listed in this order of priority? It's better for us to minimise our impact on the environment by simply using less from the start. Asking ourselves if we really need something, rather than wanting it, is always a good place to start. And, we can consider using reusable items like shopping bags, reusable water bottles or coffee mugs and using containers instead of single use sandwich bags.

Then, when an item outgrows its usefulness, look for possible ways to reuse it - sometimes referred to as upcycling. Donating items when you no longer need them is another way to extend their use and prevent them ending up in landfill. Repair Cafés have become a popular way to fix different items such as household electricals, toys, clothes, bikes and more. To find a list of repair cafes locally, visit

Threats to Hedgerows

While many hedgerows are protected by law, local authorities can only say no to a hedgerow being removed if it meets a particular definition of 'important'. Roads and development, especially on the edges of towns and villages, has meant that hedges are lost; even protections for 'important' hedgerows can be overruled by permission for new developments. And although many farmers look after their hedgerows well, moves towards more intensive farming mean they can be removed.

A beginner's guide to hedgerows


If you are enjoying walks in the countryside this summer, you may have noticed that our hedgerows are full of life. But did you know just how important hedgerows are?

Hedgerows have many benefits for nature, the landscape, and the climate emergency.

They help store carbon, promote healthy soils and protect crops and animals from extreme weather.

They contain a mixture of habitats and support a wealth of different species. Over 2,100 plant, insect, bird and mammal species use UK hedgerows and 130 species that have been identified as being a priority for conservation are closely associated with hedgerows.

They connect us to our landscape's past, giving a sense of continuity and connection to our heritage. They keep our local areas looking distinctive and give us a sense of place.

September 25 will be a Bring and Share tea, with a Grand Raffle and a Bring and Buy in aid of Macmillan Cancer Support


We meet in the Sports and Social Club between 2 and 4 pm on the last Wednesday of the month – look out for posters. Guests always welcome

WARBOYS LOCAL HISTORY SOCIETY: Cambridge's Sporting Revolution - and a local tobacconist.

What do you know about Fenner's in Cambridge and who was Frank Fenner? In June, we enjoyed a fascinating and informative talk from Nigel Fenner. Nigel is a retired teacher, alumni of Cambridge and ex - footballer, and now an author and tour guide - and a distant relation of Frank Fenner.

We heard that in the 1800s, Cambridge was a major player in the English sporting revolution and Frank Fenner played a significant role in this – hence the name of the University cricket ground, Fenner's. Sadly Frank's achievements have been largely overlooked.

Frank was born and lived in Cambridge from 1811 till 1862. He was an entrepreneur, owning 4 tobacco shops and also loved sport. He played cricket 8 times for England and oversaw the development of the University cricket club and ground – hence the name Fenner's. Frank was a skilled diplomat – bringing together town and gown to play in one joint cricket team. Also in 1861, Frank brought, Deerfoot, a Native American, over from the States and he ran in front of 8000 people at Fenner's. He built a gym off the Market Square and promoted boxing and football.

After leaving Cambridge, he lived for 30 years in the West Country, setting up cricket clubs and running hotels. He died in 1896 and is buried in Bath Abbey cemetery.

It was eye opening to learn of the sporting significance of Cambridge. Although sporting historians debate it, football had its origins there (see the monument on Parkers Piece). The Marquess of Queensberry boxed in 1865 on Market Hill. In 1882, Cambridge University played cricket at Fenner's against Australia. The list goes on. Sports were here to stay in Cambridge.

On Monday 1July, Joan Cole led the Society on a pub crawl around the village from her chair with a PowerPoint presentation. In the early 1900s there were 30 or more public houses and beer houses within the parish boundary, now there are only two. Joan showed archive pictures of many of them and compared these with photographs she had taken of many of the drinking establishments in more recent times. Comments on these were interspersed with ghost stories and anecdotes about various local characters. An entertaining evening enriched with the tales of local events and people.



The Old Village Board School Trust (OVBST)

The OVBST was formed when the site of the old school (where the library is currently located) was sold off and the school transferred to the new site in Humberdale Way. Some of the money was invested and the interest from that money can be used to give small grants to young people from Warboys to help with their education. Young people must live within the parish of Warboys or within half a mile of the parish boundary and should be aged less than 25 years. Grants can be used

- for the purchase of special educational materials like books or equipment for College or University
- to buy special tools needed by someone who is undergoing special training or starting out in a trade or craft
- to purchase special sporting equipment or musical instruments
- for educational travel to broaden the education and experience of young people
- to allow young people to undergo special training courses that may not otherwise be available to them

It can also be used by school and youth groups, e.g. sports, religious or uniformed groups in the Warboys area to provide equipment to further the education and development of local young people.


