#### **Community Centre Construction Update: Progress & Plans**

Warboys Parish Council is pleased to update residents on the new Community Centre's construction, which remains on track for completion by late spring/early summer 2025, following the successful demolition of the original parish centre in late October. Here are the latest updates on construction progress, funding applications, and financial management.

Since the demolition, the project has reached several key milestones. The external brickwork is nearly complete, and with the internal scaffolding now being removed, residents can see the outlined rooms and begin to visualise the Centre's internal layout. Floor screeding is scheduled to begin in December/January, while drainage works may also commence in December to keep the timeline flexible and on track.

We're excited to see the Centre taking shape and look forward to creating a modern, functional, and welcoming space for Warboys. Thank you for your continued support and patience as we work through each phase of this important project. Further updates will follow on construction, funding outcomes, and ways for the community to get involved.

# Road Safety Improvements Coming to Ramsey Road

Warboys Parish Council is pleased to announce that our Local Highways Initiative (LHI) bid for traffic calming on Ramsey Road has been

successful! Scheduled for August next year, this project will see the installation of a priority chicane with road narrowing at the village entry. This measure is designed to create an immediate speed reduction for vehicles entering the village. By narrowing the road, it will physically encourage drivers to adhere to the 30mph speed limit, helping to keep all road users and pedestrians safer. This improvement marks a significant step towards enhancing safety for everyone traveling through our community. Stay tuned for further updates.

# **Update on Planning Application Thermaco CCC** 22/151/FUL

Following a special planning meeting held on 28 October to discuss the Thermaco application (CCC/22/151/FUL) for The Old Brick Works, Puddock Hill - nearly 50 residents attended to raise their concerns. During the meeting, the Council unanimously voted to approve a response objecting to the application on several planning grounds, strengthening its previous two objections. The Council strongly encourages residents to send their own objections directly to Cambridgeshire County Council Planning PLANNINGDC@CAMBRIDGESHIRE.GOV.UK. # Huntingdon District Council (HDC) Local Plan Update

The District is required to update its local plan every 5 years. As part of the ongoing process of updating the HDC Local Plan, a total of 12 sites have been put forward for potential development in Warboys. These 12 sites have been submitted by residents, landowners, and developers for a variety of development purposes, ranging from housing to recreation. Warboys Parish Council has posted a list of all 12 proposed sites on the council website, which you can view at <a href="https://www.warboyspc.info/">www.warboyspc.info/</a>. These sites fall under the Northeast Huntingdonshire area, and full details can also be found on the HDC consultation website at letstalkhuntingdonshire.net. While Warboys Parish Council has formally objected to

these proposals, we strongly encourage all residents to voice their views and share their responses even if the deadline has passed Your input is vital in shaping the future of our community, so please take the time to review the proposals and have your say as soon as possible. #### **NEWS FROM THE MOAT HOUSE**

Our Medical Secretaries Karen Harris and Clare Webster are responsible for sending all **GP and clinical staff referrals.** They aim to have all urgent 2 week referrals completed within 24 working hours, urgent referrals within

48 working hours and routine referrals within 7 working days. The waiting lists at the hospital can be extremely long, anything from 12-18 months for a routine referral. This is also having a knock on effect with results and clinic letters following the patient appointment. Please keep this in mind if you are being referred / seen by the hospitals.

Reception is currently experiencing staff shortages, so you may find that you are waiting longer on the phone or at the front desk. We are sorry for any inconvenience this may cause you; we ask for your understanding and kindness in these times and to be patient with the team.

If you are planning on a wonderful exotic holiday and require **travel advice / vaccines**, please allow at least 6 weeks to drop off any travel forms at the surgery prior to your departure date. If you do not have this timeframe, there are lots of travel clinics around the area that could help.

Now we are in winter, we can expect an increase in colds, sore throats and other viral illnesses. Please always remember that local pharmacies, including Wards, may be able to help you initially rather than your GP surgery. The NHS launched 'Pharmacy First' on 31st January 2024 which adds to the existing consultation service and enables community pharmacists to offer care to seven common conditions- see the table below:
